

### **Leadership Cereal Box Project**

For this final project, you will be researching about a person from history and their leadership qualities. You will research using the textbook, and sources from the internet. Make sure you do not plagiarize! Then you will type, print, and glue sections of writing and one drawing to a cereal box for a 2-3 minute presentation. You will need to use a regular sized cereal box for this project. All of the information needs to be typed. Make sure the font is Times New Roman and the size is 12.

**On the back of the box**, you will glue a typed paragraph about the person you chose and how they show leadership.

Directions for Leadership Paragraph:

You need to make sure that you include the following information when you write a paragraph on the person of your choosing. Your paragraph must be at least 6-8 sentences.

- When was this person alive?
- Who is this person and what did they do?
- How did this person show leadership?
- Why is this person relevant to History?

**On the side panel of the box**, you will create and glue a “Fun Facts” section. This should include any interesting facts that you have found on the person that you have selected to make this project about. This section should include 10 facts that you previously didn’t know about them.

**On the front of the box**, you will be drawing a picture of the person you chose. This picture should be as accurate as you can make it, but it should be colored and neat. It should take up a majority of the front side of the box. Draw it on plain paper, not lined.

**On the other side panel of the box**, explain which virtues your person exemplifies. What do these virtues mean? How does the person show these virtues? How is this person great hearted? Make sure you use details to support your answers! (5-6 sentences)

**Presentation:** You will present on your leader for 2-3 minutes with your cereal box, and you will be graded on content, creativity, and effort (be professional and engaging, speak clearly).

Below is a list of leaders you may chose from; if you have a leader you wish to research that is not on this list, you must have it approved by your teacher first. We will be signing up for leaders on Monday, Dec 11, so be ready with your first three choices. Any person with an asterisk is someone we have not gone over in class, but is mentioned in the textbook.
